A good shepherd/father GUIDES. Read Proverbs 20:7. God calls  
fathers to live with integrity. As you guide your children, do you  
make sure that you are a godly example? What are ways that you  
can assure your integrity is the pattern for your children to follow?

A good shepherd/father PROVIDES. Read Matthew 7:9-11.  
A father has a responsibility to provide for the physical needs of his  
children. As a godly father, how do you make sure all of these  
needs are met? What similarity do you see in how the Lord  
provides for you?

A good shepherd/father CORRECTS. Read Proverbs 3:11-12 and 2  
Timothy 3:15-17.

A father is responsible to correct and discipline his children. In  
what ways do you provide godly correction for your children? Are  
there ways that you can improve the way you discipline them to  
align better with scripture?

A good shepherd/father PROTECTS. Read Proverbs 14:26.  
A father who is a follower of God will instill a reverence for God in  
his children. How does this reverence work to protect us as His  
children? How do you teach this reverence to your children?
