

Review John 11:1-44.

“I am The Resurrection and The Life” does not exclusively indicate Jesus’ resurrection from the dead or the resurrection on the last day. What does verse 25 mean to you and how have you experienced it here and now in your life?

Read Romans 8:10-11. We have already been resurrected in this life, as we are given life in Him, here and now. What testimony can you give about your new life because of the resurrection of Christ – what He has done and continues to do in your life?

In our circumstances, we can become discouraged on a daily basis. Read Romans 5:1-5. How does this verse tie in with the concept of The Resurrection and The Life?

John 10:10 says, “The thief comes only to steal, kill, and destroy; I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly. This refers to our life now, on Earth. The abundant life we live will point others to Christ. Are you content to seek the Lord’s provisional abundance? What have you been seeking that may be your own desires? Moving forward, how can you be sure your focus is on the abundant life the Lord desires for us?”
